**Directions from East or West: Take I-86(St. Rt. 17) to Horseheads then exit south on Grand Central Ave. Fairgrounds is approx. 1/2 mile on the left.**

1. Every class offered herein which is covered by the rules and specifications of the current US Equestrian Federation Rule Book will be conducted and judged in accordance therewith. For complete class specifications, see the current USEF Rule Book.
2. All horses entered in this competition must be registered with the American Morgan Horse Association, the Canadian Morgan Horse Association, the British Morgan Horse Association, or if under one year of age, must be eligible for registration.
3. The committee reserves the right to cancel or reduce to ribbons, any class or division which, in their opinion, has not sufficiently filled. Any adjustments in premiums, ribbons, etc, must be rectified with the office immediately following the class in question.
4. No person will be allowed in the show ring during the time of judging except those having duties to perform.
5. Exhibitors are notified that any act of discourtesy or disobedience to the Judge or Officials, on the part of the owner, rider, trainer, or groom shall disqualify the horse and rider and the owner shall forfeit his entrance and other fees.
6. In amateur classes, all riders 18 years and over must possess a current Amateur certification issued by USEF or CEF or apply for a card at the show.
7. **Amateur classes are restricted to adult riders (Over 18 yrs) unless noted otherwise. Classic and Amateur In Hand Divisions are excluded from the adult restriction.**
8. First and Second place In-Hand horses **must** show back for In-Hand Championships. First and Second place Specialty (Hunter In-Hand, Western In-Hand, Classic In-Hand) must show back for Specialty In-Hand Championship. First and Second place Amateur In Hand must show back for Amateur Championship. No entry fee.
9. Horses **must** be nominated for championship classess **prior** to the session they are in, at which time name and descriptions of entries must be made in writing by the owner or agent.
10. Please be advised that the signatures of the exhibitor and/or owner and the trainer indicate that they agree to abide by the USEF Rules.
11. **Entries must be postmarked on or before May 3, 2008. Horses not entered prior to May 3 will be charged a \$15.00 late fee and will not be listed in the show program.** No post entry fees will be charged for horses duly entered that elect to enter additional classes.
12. Exhibitors may arrive anytime after 2 pm. on Wednesday, May 21, 2008. Stalls are permanent with doors. Feed and bedding will be available for purchase on the grounds – bedding may be pre-ordered, please see the form with this prize list.  
**Stall fee: \$75. Showing off trailer \$25. There will be no overnight stabling in trailers. NO STALLS WITH BE RESERVED WITHOUT PAYMENT.**
13. Entries wishing to be stabled together **MUST BE SUBMITTED TOGETHER.** If entries warrant, **tack stalls may be limited.**
14. There is an **office fee of \$10 per horse.**
15. A maiden class is open to horses which have not won a first place ribbon; a novice class is open to horses which have not won three first place ribbons; a limit class is open to horses which have not won six first ribbons, at regular member shows of USEF.
16. A Junior Exhibitor is a person who has not reached his/her 18<sup>th</sup> birthday as of December 1, 2007.
17. Protective Headgear: See page in prize list addressing this issue.
18. NOTE: All horses entering the show must have negative Coggins certificate (EIA). New York State horses must have a Coggins certificate for 2007 or 2008. Out of state and Canadian horses must have a Coggins test within 12 months. All out of state horses are required to have a health certificate within 30 days. Proof of Rabies vaccination must be presented for all horses.
19. There will be a **surcharge of \$25** for all checks returned as NSF.
20. **As of January 1, 2008 smoking is not permitted in any Chemung County Park, the county may fine violators.**
21. All dogs must be leashed.
22. Sound System: Plans are to have a call system to the barns, however as always Exhibitors are responsible for determining when their class will be held.
23. Should any question or dispute arise which is not provided for in the foregoing rules, the same shall be referred to the Committee, whose decision shall be final.
24. About Refunds: Scratches – “It is the responsibility of all exhibitors to officially scratch entries in any event in which they do not plan to participate.” **Exhibitors who fail to come to the Horse Show Office to scratch an entry will be charged \$20.** There will be no refunds for scratches – credit will be given toward post entries in other classes. Entry fees will be refunded upon request before May 10<sup>th</sup>. After this date, fees will be refunded upon receipt of a veterinarian’s certificate. A bona fide casualty to an exhibitor or exhibitor’s family is eligible. There will be a **\$15 office charge** on all refunds. **Stall fees will not be refunded.**
25. All premium checks will mailed within 30 days of the conclusion of the show.
26. There will be a **\$75 Camper fee** for anyone camping on the grounds, regardless of whether or not they are hooked up to available services. For additional nights (Thurs to Sat is covered by the \$75 fee), camping will be \$25/night.
27. The Morgan shall be shown in all his natural beauty with a full mane, forelock, and tail. Braiding is permitted only in Hunter, Dressage, ADS Carriage Classes or in classes when under proper Hunter or Dressage tack and attire.
28. Rings and Footing: Footing is sand. Main show ring is approximately 150’ x 285’.
29. **LIFE, SENIOR ACTIVE, AND JUNIOR ACTIVE MEMBERS SHALL BE ELIGIBLE TO PARTICIPATE IN ALL CLASSES AT REGULAR COMPETITIONS, EVENTING COMPETITIONS, AT THE PRELIMINARY LEVEL OR ABOVE AND COMBINED DRIVING COMPETITIONS AT THE ADVANCED LEVEL, DRESSAGE AND VAULTING COMPETITIONS AND ENDURANCE RIDES PROVIDED THE REPECTIVE BREED/DISCIPLINE CATEGORY FEE HAS BEEN PAID. A NON-MEMBER MAY PARTICIPATE AS A 1) HANDLER, RIDER, 2) EXHIBITIONS; 3) GAMES AND RACES; 4) CLASSES FOR 4-H MEMBERS; 5) WALK TROT AND ACADEMY CLASSES (Academy classes are classes limited to horses used regularly in a lesson program); 6)USDF INTRODUCTORY LEVEL TESTS, PAS DE DEUX AND QUADRILLE CLASSES. ALSO EXEMPTED FROM THIS REQUIREMENT ARE RESIDENTS OF OTHER NATIONS WHO ARE MEMBERS IN GOOD STANDING OF THEIR NATIONAL FEDERATION; 7) USEF BEGINNER NOVICE DIVISION; 8) ASSISTANT HANDLERS IN DRESSAGE SPORT HORSE BREEDING CLASSES, AND 9) CITIZENS OF OTHER NATIONS WHO ARE MEMBERS IN GOOD STANDING OF THEIR NATIONAL FEDERATIONS, AND IN CASE OF RIDERS, DRIVERS OR VAULTERS COMPETING IN DISCIPLINES RECOGNIZED BY FEL, IN POSSESSION OF A FOREIGN COMPETITORS LICENSE TO COMPETE IN NATIONAL COMPETITIONS, WHICH HAS BEEN ISSUED BY THE FEDERATION.**

Riders in Walk/Trot classes may not have shown in any class requiring a canter, and may not compete in any other class at the show with the exception of Fitting and Showmanship. Entries **not** to be asked to back.

### Carriage

Entry Fee: \$20

USEF Pleasure Driving Rules will be followed. Vehicles may be either of the 2 or 4 wooden-wheeled type. Wire wheeled vehicles, martingales and overchecks are not allowed. Sidechecks are optional. Snaffle bits, Liverpool bits or any other traditional driving bits are allowed. A throatlatch and a cavesson (noseband) are mandatory. Style of driving (one or two-handed) is optional. At all times while in the ring, drivers **MUST** wear a hat (or an ASTM/SEI certified helmet if junior), gloves, apron or lap robe, and carry a whip in hand. Anyone failing to do so must be severely penalized by the judge. Any junior driver (or junior riding as a passenger with an adult) not wearing the approved headgear **MUST** be eliminated from the class. **Under no circumstances or condition should a bridle ever be removed from a horse while it is still put to a vehicle. Such an action will result in instant elimination. Canter is prohibited in all obstacle classes.**

#### 88. Carriage Driving – Working Pleasure

A pleasure driving class in which entries are judged primarily on the suitability of the horse to provide a pleasant drive. To be judged 70% on performance, manners and way of going, 20% on the condition and fit of the harness and vehicle, 10% on neatness of attire.

#### 89. Carriage Driving – Reinsmanship

A pleasure driving class in which entries are judged primarily on the skill of the driver. To be shown at a walk, slow trot, working trot and strong trot. Drivers will be required to rein back. All drivers chosen for a workout may be worked at any gait requested by the judge and may be asked to execute a figure eight and/or perform other appropriate tests. To be judged 75% on handling of the reins and whip, control, posture, and overall appearance of the driver; 25% on the condition of the harness and vehicle and neatness of attire.

#### 146. Carriage Driving – Super Reinsmanship

Judged primarily on the ability and skill of the driver. Entries enter the ring individually and complete figures at a prescribed pace while negotiating a small number of cones. The entry receives a numerical score. 80% for handling of the reins and whip, control, posture and 20% on overall impression of the turnout, condition of the harness and vehicle and neatness of attire.

#### 147. Carriage Driving – Timed Obstacle

To be driven over a prescribed course of obstacles, not to exceed 15 obstacles. After passing the starting line, the driver shall proceed through each obstacle to the designated finish line. Course faults are scored as penalty seconds and are added to the driver's elapsed time, 5 seconds for each dislodged or knocked down obstacle. Missing an obstacle means elimination. Placings are determined on a low time basis. **Cantering is prohibited.**

#### 148. Carriage Driving – Scurry Obstacle

To be driven over a course of unnumbered obstacles consisting of cones and rails. After passing the starting line competitors shall proceed at the trot through each obstacle in any order from any direction. Each obstacle must be driven once. Upon completion of the course the whip must cross the finish line where time will be taken. A five second penalty will be assessed for dislodging a ball or any part of an obstacle while on course. Run-outs or refusals will not be penalized. The circling rule does not apply. **Cantering is prohibited.** The first three breaks into a canter will each incur a five second penalty. The fourth break or any prolonged cantering will incur elimination. Missing an obstacle, the use of tie-downs and overchecks, and failure to carry a whip incurs elimination. Ties for first place will be decided by a drive-off.

#### 149. Carriage Driving – Progressive Obstacle

To be driven at the trot with a set time over a course of six numbered obstacle which will be adjusted to the following clearances: #1 – 20", #2 – 16", #3 – 12", #4 – 8", #5 – 4", #6 – 2". Time allowed to be calculated at 200 ft. per minute. After passing the starting line, the driver shall proceed through each obstacle, in order, until finishing the course or dislodging an obstacle. Time will be stopped when the rear axle clears the last obstacle or when an obstacle is dislodged. Placings will be determined by the greatest number of points. Time will decide ties. **Cantering is prohibited.**

### Dressage (USEF/USDF Competition Recognition Number 1940)

Entry Fee: \$25

Tests are the current USDF and USEF tests. Readers will be permitted. Riders may be limited to two (2) tests per horse, if entries warrant. No more than 50 rides will be accepted. Tests will be ridden in a large arena (60 x 20 meters); the footing is sand. Each competitor in Dressage is responsible for supplying Management with correct USDF numbers for horse, owner and rider. Scores of competitors who fail to supply correct numbers may not be counted toward national awards. **It is also the responsibility of the competitors to indicate on their ENTRY FORM which test they will be riding in the Choice Classes (160, 161, 162 and 163 and 164).**

**No post entries will be accepted in the Dressage after May 10, 2008 without approval of Dressage Coordinator.** Times will be posted in the Show Office and e-mailed to competitors who provide e-mail addresses on their entry forms. **For further information contact:**

Each competitor is responsible for supplying management with correct association memberships (USDF, United State Equestrian Federation) for horse, owner, rider and trainer before the day(s) of competition. The scores of competitors who fail to supply correct numbers may not be counted toward National awards.

Entries must be received by May 10th to ensure a time slot. Post entries will be accepted if time slots available. This Class will not count toward Dressage High Point

## High Point Awards

**Dressage High Point:** Director's Chair, Champion and Reserve Ribbons.

Awarded to the horse/rider combination with the overall high score but, to recognize that it is more difficult for a horse competing at the higher levels to attain a given score than for a horse competing at the lower levels, the following percentages will be added to the high score: Introductory (no adjustment), Training (2%), First (3%), Second (5%), and Third and above (7%).

**Carriage High Point:** Director's Chair, Champion and Reserve Ribbons.

Points will accumulate from all carriage classes. Lowest 2 placings from obstacle classes (classes 146-129) will be dropped. Point structure is per USEF pleasure driving rules.

**Jr Exhibitor High Point:** Trophy Halter, Champion and Reserve Ribbons.

To qualify, Jr Exhibitor **must** show in a Showmanship class.

Points based on **exhibitor** and only Jr Exhibitor, Equitation and Showmanship classes to count toward award.

**Amateur High-Point:** Trophy Halter, Champion & Reserve Ribbons.

To qualify, Amateur **must** show in at least one In-Hand class in any division (Amateur In Hand, Open In Hand or Specialty In Hand, as handler). Points based on **exhibitor**, and only Amateur performance classes, Adult equitation, and in-hand (any section) to count toward award.
