

The next order of business was the report of the General Chairman and Show Manager of the Club's October Horse Show and Sale, F.H. Eisenhard. First he stated that the Club had been granted the dates of October 1st and 2nd by the American Horse Shows Ass'n. for the show, which has been awarded a Class A rating. The only other show on that date ~~XXX~~ which will include Morgan classes is in Connecticut. Relative to our Club Show, the plan now is to have either 31 or 32 classes. The first point of discussion in connection with the performance classes was regarding class 25, the N.Y. State Morgan Horse Society Member Challenge Trophy. As a result of the discussion, it was finally voted that the Class shall be a Trophy class, only, no money, also that a horse shown in this class must actually be owned by a member of the N.Y. State Morgan Horse Society. Permanent possession of the Trophy will be awarded when three wins have been made in this class.

The second discussion centered around the Pleasure classes. It was ultimately decided that in Morgan Pleasure classes under English tack, the phrase "horses may be tested on any obstacles that might be encountered on a trail" be eliminated and that the phrase "horses may be dismounted and remounted and the horses asked to back" be substituted. The only class which shall feature obstacles shall be the Trail Horse Western. These changes were unanimously voted.

The next area of discussion centered around stall fees. Mr. Eisenhard stated that the approximate amount budgeted for money prizes is \$2000. and it is considered good management practice in planning horse shows to plan on stall fee charges meeting this item in the budget. With this information in mind, a discussion from the floor was invited. Stall fees suggested ranged in price from \$25. to \$10. for box stalls with tie stalls at half these amounts. Also the question of the amount charged for animals entered only in breeding classes came up. Prices ranged from \$5.00 to \$3.00 in this connection. A motion made by John Mahoney, seconded by Bob Brooks listing stall fees for breed class animals at \$3.00 was duly voted unanimously. A motion made by Fritz Eisenhard and seconded by John Mahoney listing stall fees for performance animals at \$15. for a box stall and \$7.50 for a tie stall was duly voted unanimously.

Carole Clyne, Horse Show Chairman was called upon to explain the reasons for listing two separate classes for riders under 18 yrs. and for riders under 21 yrs. The question had been raised why classes 27 and 29 could not be combined. It was pointed out that Class 27 is judged on equitation wherein the horse is not considered, while class 29 will be judged on the ability of the horse/ and its suitability to the rider. There were no further ~~XXXXXXXXXX~~ questions on this topic.

It was announced that the Trail Horse Western Class shall be a money class paying \$20,15,10,5 and 5 instead of a trophy class as first listed on the proposed program.

The entry fees to classes shall be \$3.00 to all trophy classes, \$5.00 for all money classes except Stake classes which shall be \$10.00. Breed classes will have an entry fee of \$3.00 and the prizes shall be trophy and six ribbons.

The futurity will be under the direction of the Futurity Committee. All classes with the exception of the Yearling class shall be closed to any but animals nominated to the Futurity Committee. The yearling class shall be an open class, composed of futurity contestants as well as others.

At this time the business meeting was temporarily adjourned for dinner.
