

O-at-ka Carl Marshal

Carl Marshal was born April 23, 1964 at O-at-ka Farm in Warsaw owned by Fritz & Caroline Einker. Carl came to live with us on a cold day the 26th of Dec. as a 2½ yr. old stallion. I had dreamed of him from the first time I saw him running in pasture at O-at-ka Farm & never in my wildest dreams ever realized I'd own him. He was the kindest, gentlest most handsome horse I'd ever seen. Fritz helped me to pick out a reg. Morgan mare at an auction to cross with him. She was (L'ghorn's Henrietta) L'ghorn's Select x Harriette Jane. Next we purchased (Princess Pierette) Kane's Show Boy x Jubilee's Princess. After our barn fire the end of Sept. 1967 we went to the N.Y. Morgan Show to get our mind off

the fire and at the auction I realized Fred had just purchased the mare (Broadwall Patty Sue) Broadwall St. Pat X Broadwall Lucie Q. We had no barn and several horses at home to find a place for. Our good neighbor had a bull stall in his barn & kept Carl until we got our barn built & a stall ready. We did have a run in and a chicken coop so the horses could get under cover. The barn was ready the end of Jan. 1968. We had 3 pregnant mares at this time but all did well. These 3 mares were our foundation and we used Carl Marshal as sire exclusively except for one outside breeding of Princess Pierette to Elm Hill Charter oak. We were a small breeding farm but had so much fun with our family & the horses. The thing that always pleased me most was the enjoyment the owners got out of the horse they

Purchased from us and the super people we met in the Morgan world.

My daughter Anita + I had some of our greatest times together showing + trail riding. These are the memories that sustain me since I can no longer ride.

We still own (Andai Poima) Rosie 27 yrs. young and a super horse for the grandkids. Also my pride + joy Andai Chantilly Lace who is double Carl Marshal in 5th + 6th generation, + everything I could have dreamed of. I had hoped to trail-ride her at least until I was 70. I have offered her for sale to the right situation and hopefully by the time this comes out she will be with the couple who are now going through the process and are just what I had hoped for for her. She is a very special horse with

most of my bloodlines in her pedigree.

Carl Marshal sired 46 registered foals and numerous $\frac{1}{2}$ Morgans, some looked more like Morgans than registered. His foals went on to be Western Pl., Eng pl., Carriage Driving, jumping trail. Many were Champions. A few that were well known, Andai Beau, Andai Royal Destiny, Andai Royal Favorite & Andai Royal Fable, Andai Royal Legacy. Granddaughter Andai Debutante did a super job as many times Western Pl. champion as well as broodmare extraordinary. Carl's fillies crossed great with whatever stallion they were bred to. I was always sorry that more weren't kept as stallions. The 2 that were did very well, Andai Royal Majesty & Andai Royal Marshal

Carl died in his sleep 2 days before Christmas just before his 26th yr.
